Wow, so much has happened and is happening since my last article, I don't' know where to begin.

First and foremost, many of you may have heard by now that Leslie Bash,

the JCC Executive Director, is retiring. After almost a decade of wonderful service to our community, Leslie has decided to take some time for herself. I am sure you all recognized Leslie's dedication to the JCC as she was always at the JCC for meetings in the evenings and often on weekends. What you may not realize, is that Leslie continued to live in West Bloomfield for all those years, driving back and forth to Ann Arbor, even on snowy days to make sure the JCC flourished. We are all very grateful to Leslie for the leadership she has provided over her tenure. The accomplishments she championed even since I have been on the board are very impressive. I hope you will all join us for our 25th Anniversary Auction Celebration in March when we will celebrate Leslie's retirement.

So we are just beginning the search for a new director. I asked Nancy Margolis to chair the search process and she has assembled a committee of individuals from various segments of our community. The position has been advertised and we will be reviewing resumes by the end of October. Our goal is to have someone in the position by March or April.

Over this summer Hebrew Day School's Gan room was renovated as well as the JCC Lounges. The HDS Gan project was mostly funded by the Hebrew Day School, and the lounge renovation was funded by a matching grant from the Jewish Cultural Society and donations from Newman, Gelman and Levine families, the Reconstructionist Havurah and you, our community members. The lounges were completed just in time for Rosh Hashanah. If you haven't seen these new renovations, stop in and take a look!

Also this summer our Maccabi team went to Omaha and brought back over 25 medals in five different sports, including dance, volleyball, soccer, tennis and swimming. Next summer Maccabi is taking place in Israel and the dates are earlier – the last week in July and the first week in August. The trip includes several days of touring as well as the usual Maccabi Sports and Arts Festival.



Join Ann Arbor's Maccabi Team!



Each summer the JCC sends a team of athletes to the JCC Maccabi Games, an Olympic-style sporting competition that incorporates community service and social activities to combine for an unforgettable experience for Jewish teens.

This past summer, Ann Arbor and its Partnership 2000 (P2K) sister community, Nahalal, joined forces to send 13 teens to compete in the JCC Maccabi Games in Omaha, Nebraska. Our athletes brought home over 25 medals and many wonderful memories.

Next summer, Ann Arbor athletes will have the option to attend one of two different sites:

Israel (various cities) from July 24 - August 5

The Israel Games will feature five days of touring Israel and visiting P2K sister communities, and four days of sports competition. Teens will be able to compete in basketball, bowling, soccer, swimming, table tennis, tennis, and girls volleyball. There will also be opportunities for teens to participate in an arts specialty such as dance, visual arts, or music instead of a sport. For the Israel Games, teens must be JCC members and must be 14-17 years old as of July 31, 2011.

Springfield, Massachusetts from August 14-19

Teens will be able to compete in girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, volleyball, track and field, swimming, bowling, golf, and tennis. For the Springfield Games, teens must be JCC members and must be 13-16 years old as of July 31, 2011.

Athletes of all abilities are welcome to participate, and scholarship assistance will be offered for qualifying families. A limited number of spots are available, so interested families are encouraged to contact Deborah Huerta as soon as possible at deborahhuerta@jccfed.org or (734) 971-0990.
